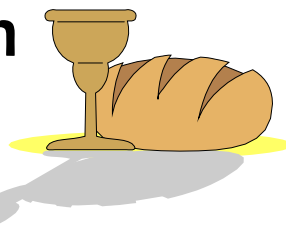
10am Morning communion

Please stay after today's service for a cup of tea or coffee and refreshments in the room to the rear of the building.

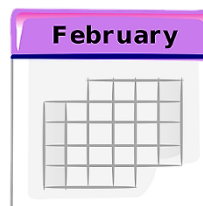
The flowers today are in loving memory of Frances Percival's dad, Frank Lolley.

Churches together in Cricklade & Latton have the CEO of Embrace the Middle East coming to Cricklade United Church on **Tuesday 10 March 2026** at 7pm. Jamie Eyre will be speaking on 'Acts of Hope: Stories of Resilience and Faith in the Middle East'. Jamie has been working for Embrace the Middle East since 2013. After leading on programmes and partnerships he became CEO in July 2024. He has travelled to the Middle East during the last year and therefore will be talking about situations he has seen for himself. The talk will be followed by a Question & Answer session. Tea and coffee will be served after the event and there will be a retiring collection for Embrace the Middle East. Embrace the Middle East has been supporting Christians and communities in the Middle East for many years, tackling poverty and injustice in the region. There is a poster on the noticeboard in the creche area.



Emmanuel Front Garden: Paul is stepping down from tending the front part of our church garden, so we are looking for one or two volunteers to take on this role. Paul's section includes the trees and shrubs right in front of the building and some planters – things people see as they walk past or approach from the street. If you can do pruning, weeding, etc and are interested to know more about what is involved, please speak to Paul or Kevin Martin. The responsibility for the upkeep and care of the Orchard & gardens is split between a team, so nobody is left without support.
